

Lacebark Elm

Ulmus parvifolia



- Form: Rounded, Vase
- Size: 40-50' tall by 35-50' wide
 Zone: 5-10

Growth Rate: Moderate

Drought Tolerance: Moderate Salt Tolerance: Moderate

Light Requirements: Full sun to partial shade

Soil Requirements: Well-drained, moist, fertile, humus rich, slightly alkaline to slightly acidic

Bark: Smooth; gray when young; matures to gray, green, orange, and brown; showy trunk; bark exfoliates to reveal random mottled patterns

Flower: Green; inconspicuous; blooms in late Summer to Fall **Fruit:** Green or brown, flat, membranous samara seed in middle; distal end clefted or notched, ½" long by ¼" wide; in axillary clusters

Foliage: Alternate, simple, elliptical to ellipticlanceolate and leather with simple to (crenate) rounded, serrated leaf margin; medium to dark green leaves turn yellow to yellow-brown and shed during Fall

Uses: Grown successfully in urban areas with poor conditions; good for street and median settings
