

Sawtooth Oak

Quercus acutissima



- Form: Broad Rounded
- Growth Rate: Fast
- Size: 35-50' tall by 35-50' wide **Zone:** 5-9
- Drought Tolerance: Moderate Salt Tolerance: Moderate Light Requirements: Full sun

Soil Requirements: Well-drained, moist, fertile, humus rich, slightly acidic soils; adaptable to many soil types except alkaline or water-logged soil

Bark: Smooth; ash gray when young; matures to dark gray with deep fissures and corky ridges

Flower: Gray green to tan male catkin; yellow, green to tan female flower matures to brown acorn; blooms in late Winter to early Spring

Fruit: Large, brown acorn, $1 - 1 \frac{1}{4}$; abundantly produced in large quantities; attracts animals

Foliage: Alternate, simple, long oblanceolate; 4-8" by 1 ½-2 ½" wide leaves; strongly serrated margins; dull to glossy yellowgreen leaves mature to green; turns dull to brownish tan color in Fall. Leaves gradually shed, but most remain on the tree thought late Winter
