

Willow Oak Quercus phellos



- Form: Broad pyramidal
- Growth Rate: Moderate
- Drought Tolerance: High
- Size: 60-75' tall by 40-50' wide
 Zone: 6-9
- Salt Tolerance: High

Light Requirements: Full sun tolerates partial shade Soil Requirements: Well-drained, moist, fertile, humus rich, slightly acidic soil; adaptable to clay, loam and sandy soils; moderately tolerant of wet soils and infrequent flooding Bark: Smooth; gray when young; matures to dark gray to grayish black with shallow fissures; ridges and irregular; small plates and scales

Flower: Olive-green to tan male catkin; brown-green female flower, matures to grayish brown acorn; blooms in late Winter to Spring; male flowers produce and abundance of pollen Fruit: Small, grayish brown, oval-shaped acorn, $3/8 - \frac{1}{2}$ "; can cause litter problems in public access areas Foliage: Alternate, simple, coarsely lobed; new growth emerges

reddish and matures to a dull, dark green leaves; turns orange red to scarlet in Fall

Shade tree in parks, lining streets and boulevards, buffer strips, medians, or reclamation plantings
